MINUTES

Call to Order: Meeting called to order by Chairman Nordmeyer at 7:00 pm.

Discussion, Consideration and Recommendation on the following:

Fire & Rescue Department

Monthly Report – Chief Austin stated officer appointments and elections for Chief, Deputy Chiefs, and Trustees will be at their next meeting. The relicensing of the Rescue Squad as EMT basic is complete. Call attendance is up. They are getting good coverage and covering our own calls regularly. Will be undertaking a bylaw revision to merge the Fire and Rescue departments into one. We have new metro employees, one has been with us since August and the other was hired this month. They will be placed on associate member status. The hours have been adjusted with one working 7am to 3pm and the other working 8am to 4pm. The department is looking at paying them a stipend as an associate member to be available for the extra hour if they work it. Both are great guys and have really dug in.

Police Department

Monthly Report – Chief Hammett provided the year to date numbers. The narcotic/drug violations are up 75% and disorderly conducts are up 24%. He attributes this to having officers who are motivated and better educated. The midnight and 2nd shift officers have been more observant and active. This last weekend the Chief approved 38 tickets. With having the school resource officer, we are able to put a part-timer out on the road more often. We have a great group of officers.

Court Update – Forfeitures were not ready at the time of meeting. Bonds collected has been up. The court is expected to exceed the budgeted amount. Chief Hammett gave the credit to the officers who are doing an amazing job.
